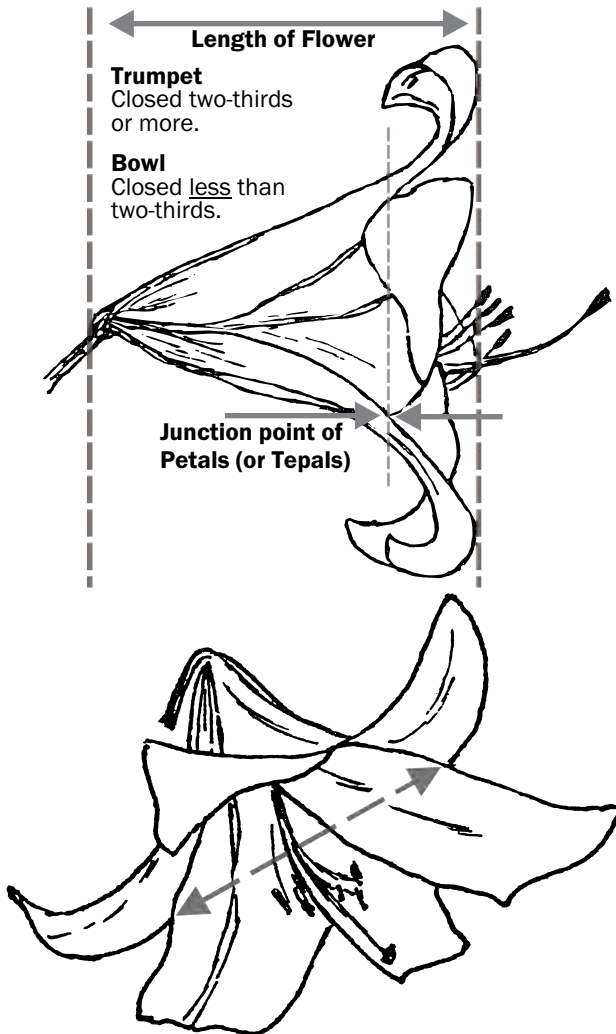

TRUMPET AND BOWL SHAPE GUIDE TO EXHIBITORS:

The formula for determining the dividing line between Trumpet and Bowl shaped lilies is as follows:

TRUMPET LILIES: To be closed at least two-thirds of length of floret (when measured from base to junction point of petals) as viewed in profile. Viewed from the front of the flower, the distance from opposite junction points to be NO MORE than two-thirds of the length of the flower in profile.

BOWL SHAPED LILIES: To be closed less than two-thirds of length of floret (when measured from base to junction point of petals) as viewed in profile. Viewed from the front of the flower, the distance from opposite junction points to EXCEED two-thirds of the length of the flower in profile.



PROFILE OR SIDE VIEW

Length of the flower measured from the base to the point where reflexing begins, not including portion of petal reflexed or turned back to face the rear of the flower.

The junction is where the petals (or tepals) cross or separate. The base of the flower is the point where the flower meets the pedicel.

FRONT VIEW

The flower viewed from the front to expose the full width of flower and the depth of the throat.

The measurement is taken across the flower from one junction point of petals (or tepals) to the opposite junction point.

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. In these rules, the use of the singular "Judge" shall also mean the plural "Judges" where there is more than one Judge or where a judging panel is empanelled for the Show.
2. All classes shall be open without entrance fee to members and non-members. Any number of entries may be made in each class.
3. Flowers shown in competitive classes must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, having been grown by the member for at least two months prior to the date of exhibition for which they are entered. This does not apply to flowers used in decorative and photographic classes.
4. Collections shall consist of a stated number of stems of lily species, hybrids or varieties of species. Two or more varieties may be entered in a collection.
5. All exhibits must be entered in their correct classes, and a card will be provided for the name of the exhibitor and the name of the lily. Where possible, the parentage of seedlings or the Lily Society Seed list number should be given. Stewards will be in attendance to give assistance if required.
6. The attention of exhibitors, entering their hybrid seedling lilies for judging for the Founders Cup, is drawn to the fact that their entries must not have exceeded a third flowering season.
7. Abnormalities, e.g. fasciated stems, should not be entered in competitive classes.
8. Exhibits remain the property of the exhibitor who should arrange for their removal at the end of the show.
9. During staging, competitors may not move other exhibitors' entries already tabled without permission from the Show Marshal or an attending steward.
10. After judging has been completed, exhibits should not be touched or moved other than by the owner or with the authorisation of the President of the Society, or his deputy, by a Committee member or the Society's official photographer. It is particularly forbidden to remove anthers or pollen without the owner's permission.
11. First, second and third placings will be awarded in each class when the exhibit is deemed worthy by the Judge. In addition, the Judge may award "Very Highly Commended" (V.H.C.) and "Highly Commended" (H.C.) as merited. The decision of the Judge shall be final.
12. The Judge will select the Champion Lily in the show and the Reserve Champion Lily. A Blue Ribbon, the Jubilee Cup and the Society's Trophy will be awarded to the Champion Lily. A Red Ribbon and the Caroline Barker Memorial Tray will be awarded to the Reserve Champion Lily. The Champion Lily and the Reserve Champion Lily can be selected from any competitive class in the show including the multiple stem classes.

13. With the exception of the Society's Trophy, as described above, cups and trophies remain the property of the Society. They are for annual competition, being held for the current year, and **MUST BE RETURNED TO THE SECRETARY NOT LESS THAN ONE CALENDAR MONTH BEFORE BEING REQUIRED FOR PRESENTATION.** Prizes where awarded are the property of the winners.
14. In cases of disagreement as to interpretation of these rules, or in any matter not laid down in them, the decision of the Committee shall be final.
15. An individual lily growing in a pot may be exhibited in any one class from Section A to I inclusive. Lilies in containers may NOT be exhibited in the floret class.
16. Entry CARDS **MUST BE FILLED IN CORRECTLY AND CLEARLY.** Remember what you put on the entry card also goes on any placing certificates you get.
All JUNIOR entries are to be nominated by the letter "J" at the top of the entry card.
17. All entries must be staged and all exhibitors other than appointed Show Officers, must have left the Hall by 10.30am to enable judging to commence. The Show Marshall has discretionary powers in this regard.
18. The Show is open to the public at 2.00pm on the day of judging.
19. The Show Marshall reserves the right to move to their correct classes entries that have been incorrectly staged.
20. Rules relating to the Photographic section are printed in Section L.

GENERAL NOTES

Any general information concerning Shows such as location, times for staging, disposal of blooms etc., may be obtained from the Secretary, PO Box 1394, Christchurch.

The Society's shows are held in the Public Stand, Riccarton Racecourse, Racecourse Road, Upper Riccarton, Christchurch.

Flowers are welcomed from areas outside Christchurch. Air transport is the most satisfactory method of forwarding blooms. Flights will be met on request and staging attended to.

SALES TABLES:

At each Annual Show, there will be a sales table, and contributions of plants, produce etc., are welcomed.

POINTS FOR JUDGING

In judging lilies, the following points will be taken into consideration

Condition:

It is generally considered that a stem of lilies is at its best when the flowers are open but not faded, and the upper ones still in bud. The larger the number of flowers open the better, provided that the lower ones are not faded. The flowers should not be bleached in the sun, sun wilted, or otherwise in poor condition. Anthers should preferably be present. A hybridiser may remove anthers from a seedling without penalty providing that this action is nominated on the entry card.

Vigour:

Refers to the length and strength of the stem, the number and size of flowers, and the size and attractiveness of the foliage, also freedom from disease. In cutting lilies, at least one third of the foliage should be left with the bulb.

Placement:

Flowers should be arranged on the stem in a symmetrical manner and should not interfere with each other.

Substance:

Those qualities of toughness and texture of the flower which gives the bloom lasting qualities and resistance to weathering.

Form:

Judged on the basis of conformity with the type in case of species or varieties, or in the case of hybrids, the comparative attractiveness of form.

Colour:

Should be clear and attractive, especially in the new hybrids.

Difficulty in Cultivation:

This could be taken into consideration by the Judge.

TROPHIES

THE EILEEN WHITTLE TROPHY - For most points gained at the January Show by a country exhibitor living 50km or more from Cathedral Square.

THE DR MACFARLANE TROPHY - Best entry exhibited by a Junior member at the January Show.

COMPETITIVE CLASSES

SECTION A - COLLECTIONS.

1. Six different varieties, hybrids or species, 1 stem of each in separate containers. Some recognition will be given to the degree of difference. The **TORCH CUP** will be awarded to the winning entry of this class.
2. Three different varieties, hybrids or species, 1 stem of each in separate containers (e.g. 1 stem each of differing floret forms). The **BARKER MEMORIAL TROPHY** will be awarded to the winner of this class.
3. Three different varieties, trumpets, hybrids or species, 1 stem of each in separate containers.
4. Two lilies of the same clone, each in a separate container. The **EILEEN GREENWOOD TROPHY** will be awarded to the winner of this class.

SECTION B - SPECIES (one stem in each container).

5. North American. (e.g. *L. pardalinum*, *L. superbum*, *L. canadense*, *L. parryi*, etc.)
6. All other Species, i.e. Asiatics, Trumpets, Orientals, European, and any other.
(Some examples are: *L. regale*, *L. davidii*, *L. lancifolium*, *L. lankongense*, *L. nepalense*, *L. chalcedonicum*, *L. henryi*)

SECTION C - HYBRIDS (one stem in each container).

7. Division IV - North American hybrids (e.g. 'Bellingham Hybrids')
8. Division V - Hybrids of *L. longiflorum* and *L. formosanum*.

This class also includes LA (*L. longiflorum* / Asiatic) hybrids, and is split into two sub-classes:

- 8A. LA - Trumpet form.
- 8B. LA - Asiatic form.

THE MARGARET SCOTT MEMORIAL TROPHY will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most points in Division VI.

9. Division VI - Trumpets of a single colour (the reverse ribs only may have a flush of a different colour).
10. Division VI - Trumpets with more than one colour.
11. Division VI - Bowls and Flares of a single colour (the reverse ribs only may have a flush of a different colour).
12. Division VI - Bowls and Flares with more than one colour.
13. Division VI - Recurved - any colour. (e.g. 'Bright Star')
14. Division VII - Oriental hybrids e.g. *L. auratum* and/or *L. speciosum* hybrids (can include hybrids of these with *L. japonicum*, *L. rubellum*, *L. henryi*, etc.).
15. Division VIII - Orienpets (Oriental and Trumpet hybrids).

Asiatic Hybrids Division I (One stem in each container)

16. Division 1a - Upfacing flowers (e.g. 'Montreaux', 'Connecticut King').
17. Division 1b - Outfacing flowers (e.g. 'Connecticut Dream', 'Ambrosia').
18. Division 1c - Pendant flowers (e.g. 'Nutmegger', 'Red Velvet').
19. Any other hybrid lily stem not already covered in SECTION C.

SECTION D - NOVICE

A novice is an exhibitor who has not won more than three first place awards in either the stem or floret classes in the January Show.

The **DAISY COUCHMAN CUP** will be awarded to the Premier entry in this section.

The **CLAIRE PATTEN TROPHY** will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most points in SECTION D.

34. An educational exhibit, cultural, historical or literary, relating to the genus *Lilium*.

SECTION J - OPEN DISPLAY

37. A New Zealand Lily Society Award of Merit to be awarded where entries are of a sufficiently high standard.

SECTION K - DECORATIVE (Open to members and non-members)

ENTRIES MUST be phoned in to the Show Marshall before 9.00pm on the Wednesday before the Show. The Show Marshall for the current year is Rex Lyes - ph (03) 313 5007.

All classes to include lilies and have no restrictions other than any listed for a particular class.

A Blue Ribbon and the **AGNES MAUD PRINS TROPHY** will be awarded to the Premier exhibit selected from Classes 38 to 42.

The **LAMB MEMORIAL CUP** will be awarded to the best entry in Classes 38 to 42 exhibited by a man.

SECTION M - PHOTOGRAPHIC

Rules:

1. Photographs entered must be originals taken by the entrant.
2. All prints to be unframed and no larger than 13cm x 18cm (5" x 7").
3. Computer enhanced photographs may not be entered.
4. Subject matter in each class need not necessarily belong to the photographer.
5. The subject need not be identified.
6. Normal entry cards are to accompany each entry.
7. All entries to be staged by 10.30am on Show Day.
8. Mailed entries are accepted up until the day before the Show, and should be addressed to the Secretary, PO Box 1394, Christchurch. Please include: sender's name, return address and class number that the photograph is to be entered in. Entry cards will be prepared for mailed entries.
9. The Bulletin committee would appreciate being loaned or given the best entries in the various classes as this will form a valuable source of future bulletin material.

THE R I MULHOLLAND MEMORIAL TROPHY will be awarded to the Premier photographic entry in SECTION M, of the January Show.
